

2018 Census results


The 2018 New Zealand Census of Population and Dwellings was held on 6 March 2018. This is the official count by Stats NZ of how many people and dwellings there are in New Zealand.

This information sheet provides an overview of initial results from the census for people in the broad Asian ethnic group. Ethnicity is self-perceived, and a person can be part of more than one ethnic group.

Asian is the fastest growing ethnic group

At the 2018 Census there were 442,671 usual residents in Auckland who identified with an Asian ethnicity (28.2% of Auckland's population). This is an increase of 135,447 people, or 44.1%, since the 2013 Census. The Asian population has grown more rapidly than the wider Auckland population.



The Asian ethnic group is diverse

Over a third (36.0%) of the Auckland Asian population identified as Chinese and 32.3% as Indian. A smaller proportion (7.4%) identified as Filipino and a further 5.7% as Korean.


Largest Asian ethnic groups living in Auckland

Over two thirds of New Zealand's Chinese, Indian and Korean populations live in Auckland, compared to a quarter (25.5%) of those who identify as European.

The proportion of Aucklanders who are Asian has increased

In 2018, 28.2% of the total Auckland usually resident population identified with an Asian ethnicity, up from 23.1% at the 2013 Census.


Almost half of all usual residents living in Puketāpapa (49.1%) and Howick (46.5%) local board areas identified with an Asian ethnicity. Howick is home to the highest proportion of Auckland's Asian population (14.8% live there).

The maps below show the proportion of the usually resident population in Auckland's 21 local board areas who identify with an Asian ethnicity, over time. There has been an increase in all local board areas.

Auckland's Asian population has a high proportion of young adults

As the age/sex chart shows below, at the 2018 Census, almost a third (31.9%) of the Asian population in Auckland was aged between 25 and 39 years, up from 27.5% in 2013.

During that time there was a decrease in the proportion aged 15 to 24 years (17.7% in 2013 and 15.0% in 2018).

In 2018, a relatively small proportion (7.1%) were aged 65 years or older. The 65.8% growth rate in this age group between 2013 and 2018 is significantly faster than that of the Asian population overall (44.1%).



At the 2018 Census, the median age of the Asian population in Auckland was 31.9 years, compared with 34.7 years overall in Auckland. Asian females (32.9 years) have a higher median age than Asian males (30.8 years).

A note on data sources

In response to issues with the 2018 Census, Stats NZ has, for the first time, used administrative and other data to help fill gaps caused by response rates that were lower than anticipated.
