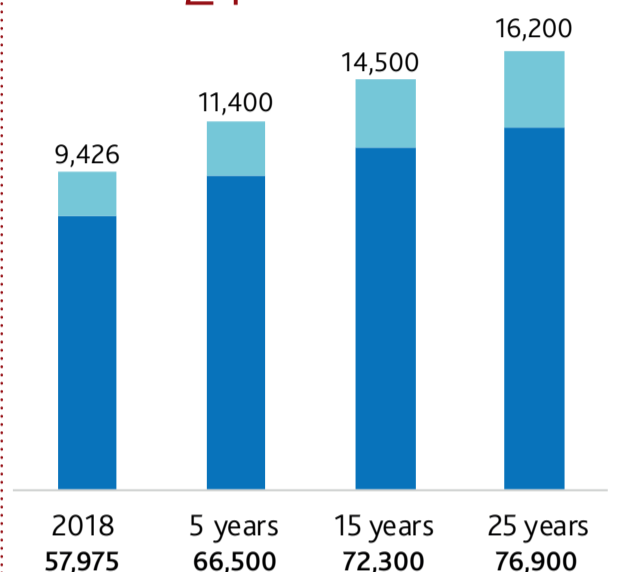
Auckland has the largest population of people aged 65 and older in New Zealand, living in different local board areas.

- financial independence.

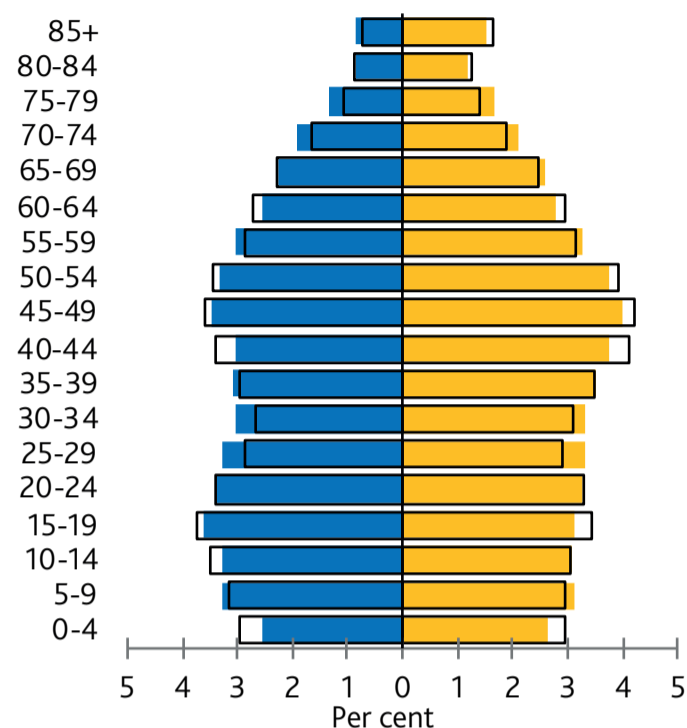
These differences affect how older people contribute and participate in their local area and wider community.

16% of the Devonport-Takapuna population was over 65 years of age in 2018 growing to 21% in 2043



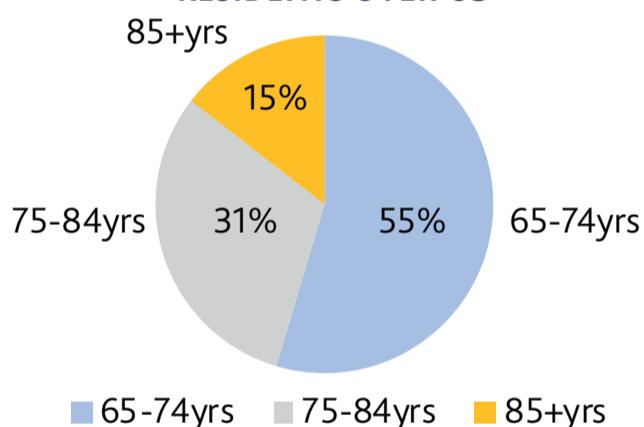
■ Devonport-Takapuna population 65 years and older

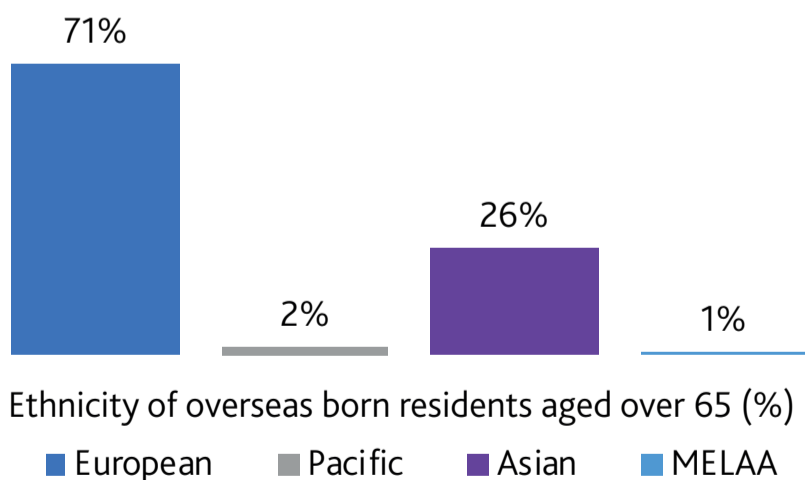
