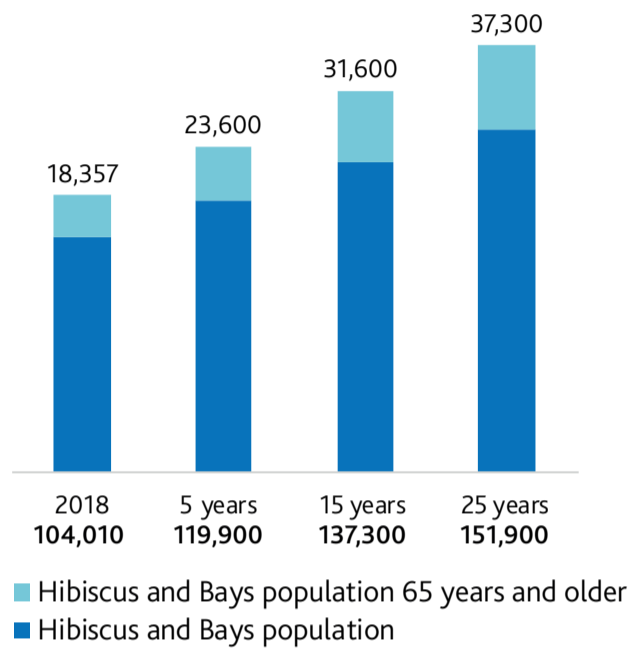
Auckland has the largest population of people aged 65 and older in New Zealand, living in different local board areas.

Auckland's older population is not a homogenous group. Differences include :

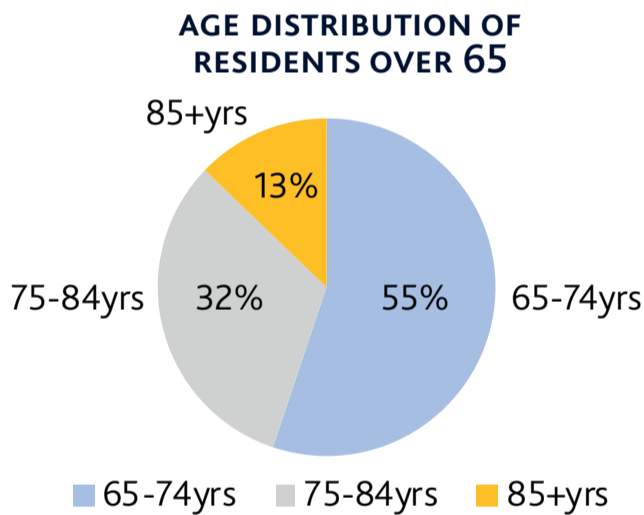
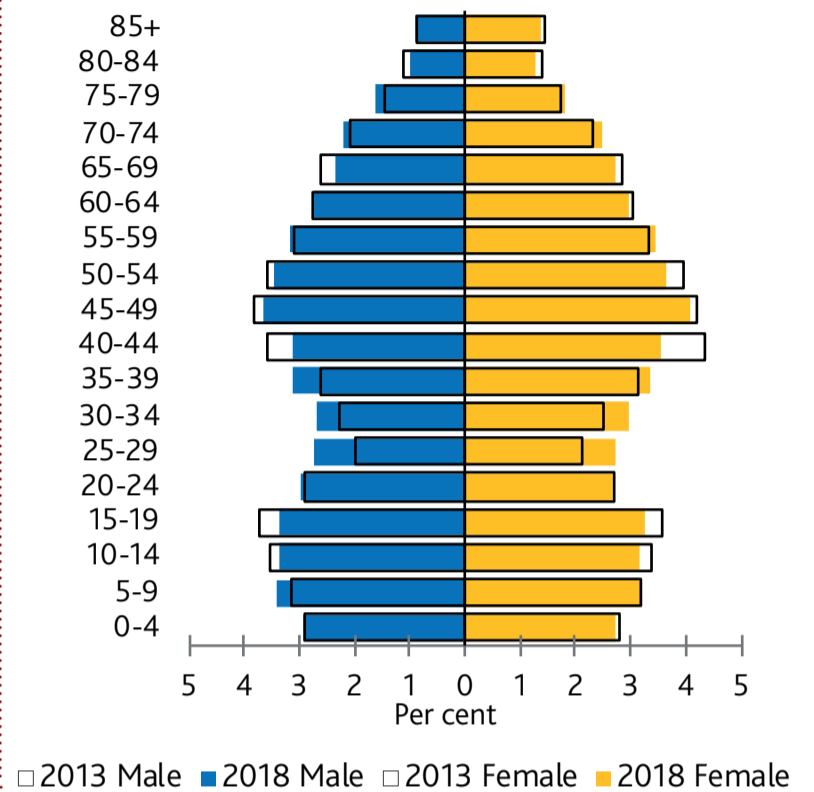
- life stages

- financial independence.

These differences affect how older people contribute and participate in their local area and wider community.

17.6% of the Hibiscus and Bays' population was over 65 years of age in 2018 growing to **25%** in 2043



There are more women than men over the age of 80 in Hibiscus and Bays

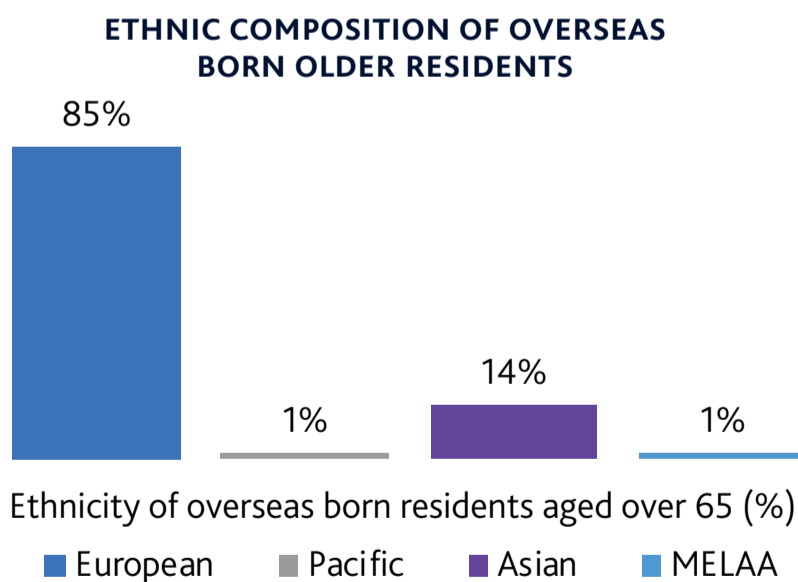
