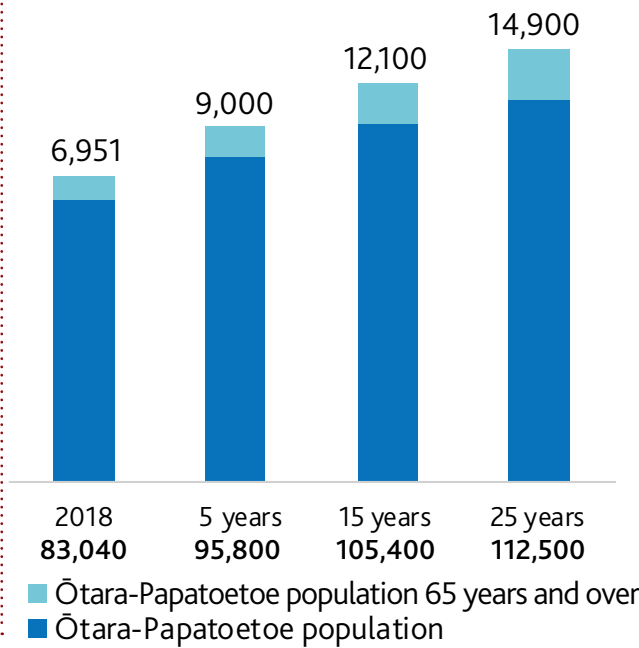
Auckland has the largest population of people aged 65 and older in New Zealand, living in different local board areas.

Auckland's older population is not a homogenous group. Differences include :

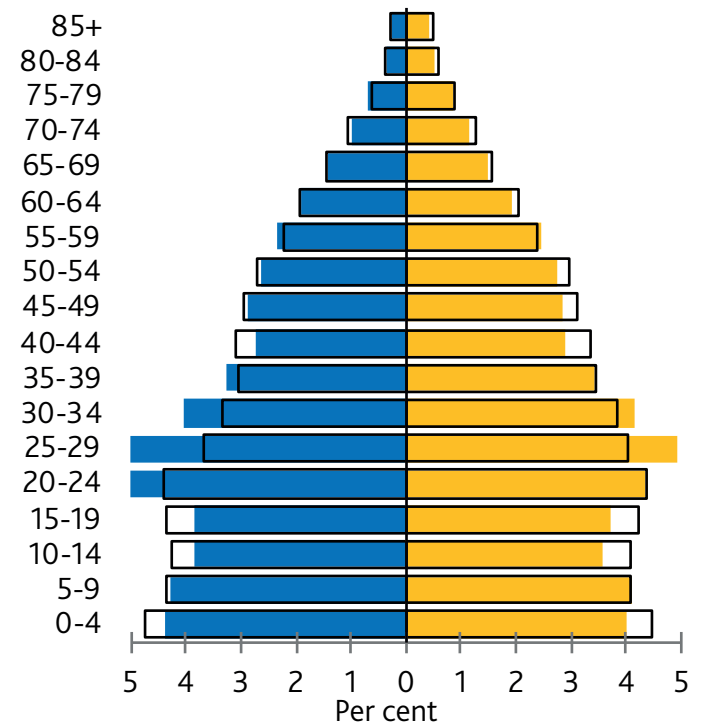
- life stages

- ethnicity and language
- rural or urban location
- financial independence.

These differences affect how older people contribute and participate in their local area and wider community.

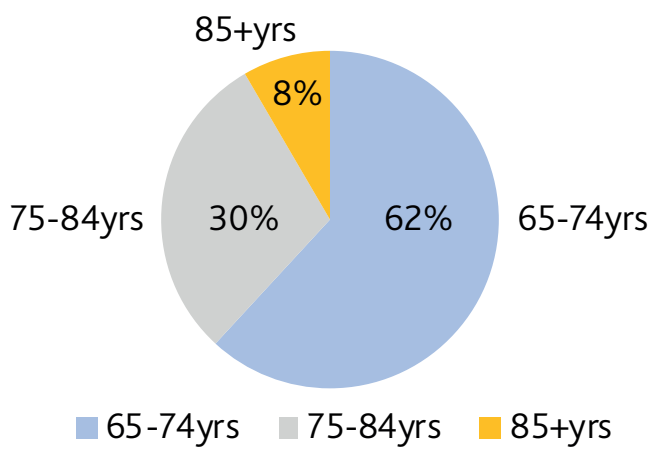
8% of the Ōtara-Papatoetoe population was over 65 years of age in 2018 growing to **13%** in 2043



8% of residents are aged 65 and over, compared with **12%** for Auckland.

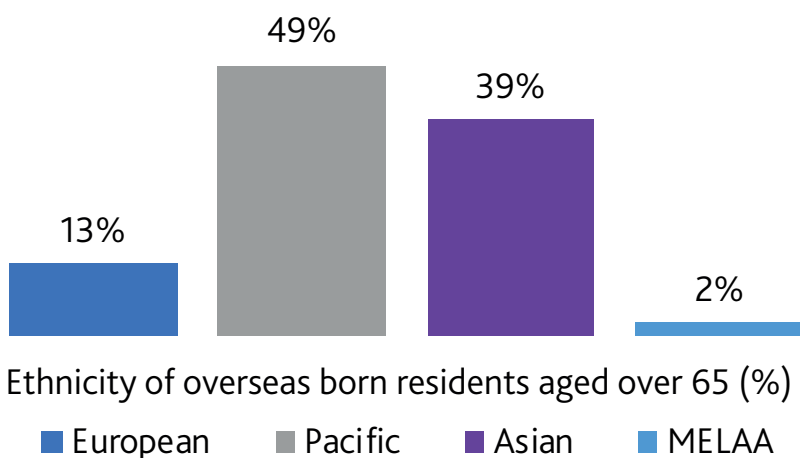
